- 2. Grass cuttings must be disposed of in an unobtrusive fashion ad not simply piled up. A good location is in the SE corner of the lake behind the wood pile. Grass should not be piled up in the front of the wood pile.
- 3. The exact timings of the toping, cutting and strimming will need to be determined by prevailing weather conditions
