

### Appendix B – report from Mr Chapple after lake inspections

All looks reasonable round the lake but I want to make one or two points for the Council to consider.

1) The new hedge that was planted behind the Scout containers look very sad and are obviously suffering from the lack of water. Just a comment. Can't see what can be done to help.

2) Lifebuoys all seem fine and I tested them by putting them in water. This seems a ridiculous procedure and unless there is the weight of a body I can't see the point. Beyond checking the integrity and general condition of the rings, I can't see what else I can do. Correct me if there is something I have missed.

3) The signs attached to the life rings are illegible and should be replaced or removed.

4) The life rings themselves should be cleaned as if they don't look in good condition they won't be respected and are likely to be abused.

5) There is only a small amount of litter left and occasionally the odd can so I don't see that as a problem. What is a problem is dog and fox poo. The north/east corner smells of fox and counted five lots of fox poo in that area. None of it on the track but just off in the longer grass. The same goes for the dog poo .. none on the track but a number of old and recent droppings a couple of feet into the longer stuff. The bins are doing their job but the problem isn't getting solved. I would suggest that the PC provides a number of 5/6 stations where poo bags can be provided freely with a notice to ask folk to clear up fox poo and dog poo .. even if it's not their own pet and deposit it in the bins provided. If it's phrased so as to appeal to their public spirit and thanks is given I'm sure there are a lot of villagers who will be pleased to play their part.

6) The brambles seem to be well under control but the nettles are taking off again. There are some very attractive wild flowers amongst them so no need to do anything at the moment. However once the flowers have died down then trimming would be a good idea. If you keep knocking nettles back they eventually cease to be a problem. At least that's what lve found on my own fields.

7) Ash tree die back - difficult to assess but the dry summer has affected a lot of trees and ash is no different. Lots with dead lower branches but all with a decent canopy. None looked to be dangerous from the point of view of Walkers round the lake or walking by the railway line.

8) Water level is of course very low at about three feet below normal. To allow for monitoring and provide interest for Parishioners, Scouts and Fishermen can I suggest a post is knocked in the water at a point where the ground shelves gently. The post to have clearly marked bands in feet and cms so that a record can be kept. The more interest that folk have in the lake the more likely they are to look after and take pride in the area.

One or two jobs I'm suggesting to be done and if the PC are agreeable to the small expenditures involved then I would be happy to do what is necessary to set things in motion.
