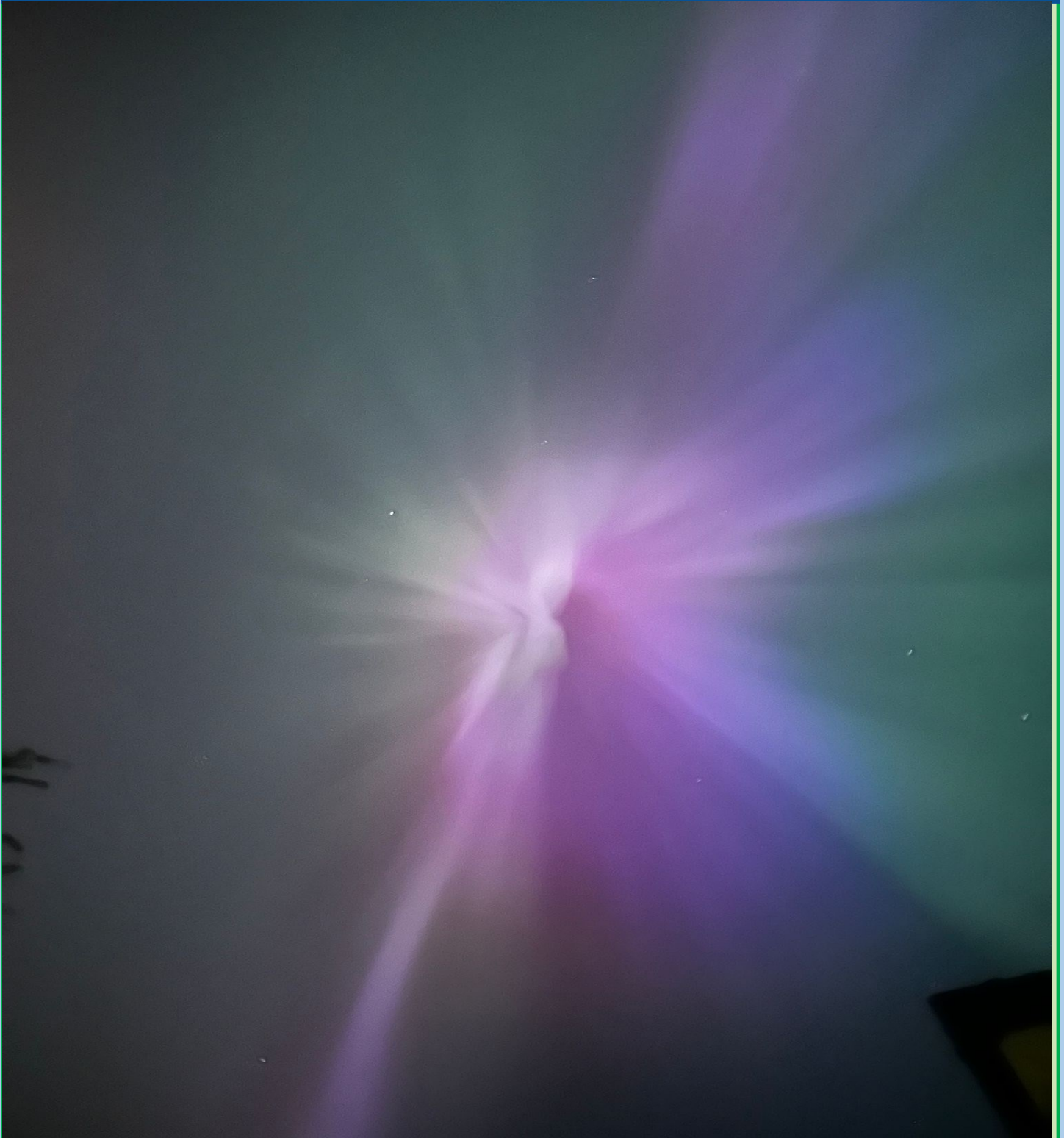

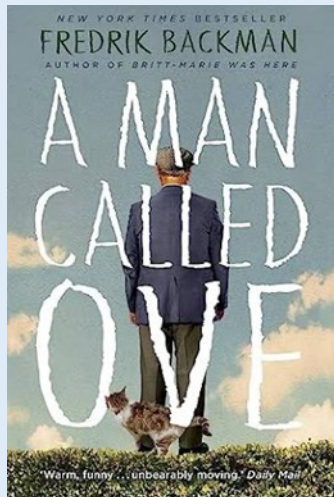

Book 58

A Man Called Ove by Fredrick Backman (7.5/10)
(26th April, 2024)



My thanks to Zoe for this report.

This book definitely split the group with scores ranging from 5 to 9.5, and an overall score of 7.5.

Once we had decided how to pronounce his name - Oover, Over, Ovey - he proved to be a tricky character to like, or even feel any empathy with - ranting, angry, rigid, and repetitively so, with this all ramped up for the entertainment value.

We universally rated the translation which we felt was deft, and obviously contributed to the international success of this first novel. We also enjoyed the amusing scenes - reversing the trailer, the encounter with Throat Tattoo during the driving lesson - and recognised ourselves in the frustrations of life involving (especially) technology and others, be they drivers, shop assistants or neighbours.

Those who enjoyed the book, and will re-read it, commented on the effect of life's losses - childhood and family, job, baby and wife - and how these shaped Ove,

although the writing on this was quite dispassionate and Ove never seemed to feel sorry for himself, which made it difficult for us to do so too.

Ove definitely was a man of 'black and white' for whom the default response was to give a swift kick, and it was to her credit that Parvaneh persisted, seeing in him the kinder soul and heart of gold which 'belonging' in his community drew out.

Annie suggested this book and treated us to Swedish crackers, gravadlax and glog... we've turned into the Book Group that drinks in the afternoon!

The Eric East Lake - Dawn Chorus

It was National Dawn Chorus Day on 5th May. I woke early, as I often do at this time of year, and was surprised at how little bird song there was compared to when I first moved to Thorpe. In those days it was so loud, with so many birds, it was impossible to get back to sleep. Later on the morning of the 5th an item on the radio commented on the same thing. The experts explanation was a decline in insect numbers, which probably explains the limited bat activity too.

Swallows, swifts, house martins and cuckoos

Where are they?

Lapwings

There has been lapwing activity towards the bottom of Clay Lane and, as these birds are on the RSPB red list, it was encouraging to see 6 on one occasion. I also saw 4 lapwings make a sustained attack on a buzzard (mobbing), eventually succeeding in driving away the much bigger bird. This suggests nests in the field. These are no more than small scrapes in the ground, often in short grassland or spring sown crops, but I'm never really sure why birds do this. The nests are especially vulnerable to agricultural activity, particularly this year when the rain prevented cultivation of the land in the autumn. Nearer to Scotland Farm, Bob Sheldon has a field set aside for lapwings.

Hedging

The hedging we planted in gaps along Bob Sheldon's Clay Lane field boundaries have benefitted greatly from the incessant rain. Some look like they're tall enough to have their tops taken out.



The Eric East Lake

At the time of writing, the island is now completely submerged. This is another indication of the amount of rain we've had over the last several months.

But there have been some positive outcomes to the heavy rainfall. The trees

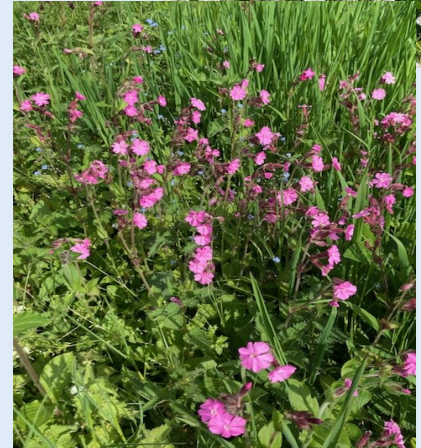
we planted have had a chance to push their roots deeper into the ground making them more resilient to the inevitable dry periods. The first photo shows a goat willow, the only survivor from 3 goat willows and 8 aspens which were donated about three years ago. Most were unable to survive the really dry periods.



The following pictures show healthy lime, cherry and walnut trees.



The wild flowers are beginning to show themselves. The next photographs show red campion and dandelions (they've had a good year)



On the water there have been broods of ducklings



... and a smew, another bird on the RSPB red list. This is a rare winter visitor, normally arriving in December and leaving from mid March. (This was photographed in April). In 2019 it was estimated that only 130 smews wintered in the whole of Britain. Well done to Mick for getting the photograph.

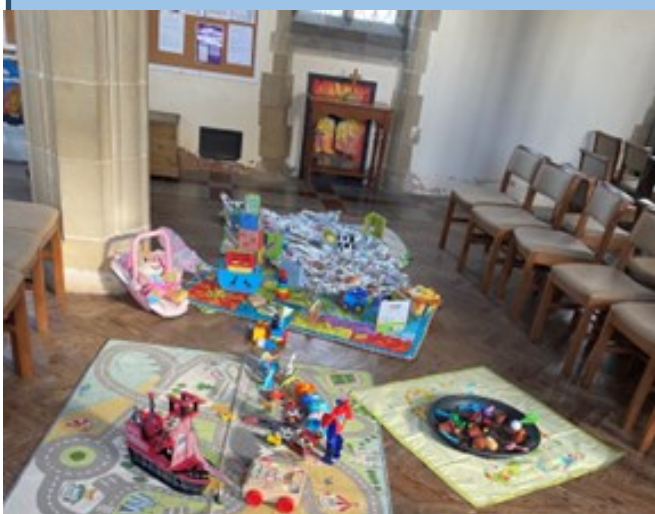

Whisby Nature Reserve and Education Centre

What a start to the year it's been at Whisby! We've had copious amounts of continuing rain and now we're starting to get the sunny heat of a possible hot, hot summer. As difficult as it may seem given the weather at the start of the year, we will need to start thinking about making sure the wildlife in our own gardens has plenty of access to fresh water. So time to dust off those shallow garden dishes and make sure your ponds have an access ramp available.

Spring is well underway so our wardens have, once again, been hard at work around the reserve keeping things ticking. From gorgeous animal babies to beautiful blooming flowers, there's lots to see at Whisby at the moment with means there's also a lot of work to do. Repairing gates and fencing, clearing fallen trees and managing livestock are only a small number of the miracles performed by our warden team each week.



Our education grounds have continued to have some TLC from our amazing maintenance volunteers and monthly RAF Work Party from our friends at RAF Waddington. Without the support and skill of teams like these, it would be a vastly different place and far harder to use. 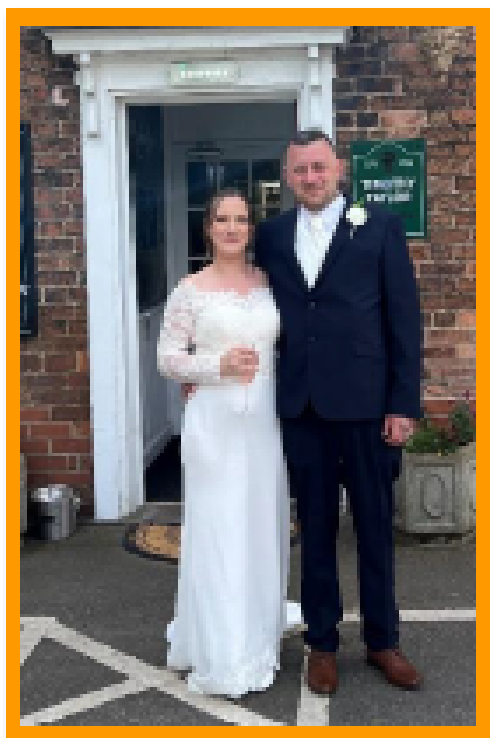

Hello,

As I sit and write this piece, I am still waiting to see my first Swift of the year. These marvellous birds migrate from the southern parts of Africa to breed here, and spend most of their lives on the wing. Normally I have seen plenty of these beauties by the end of April.

While we have had bad weather, the April cold/wet snap the absence of Swifts makes me ask are there greater issues at play, such as environmental change. Over recent months I have heard of arable farmers having to re-plant crops at least 3 times due to the unprecedented rain-fall of the autumn and winter. What this will do for food security in the coming months must be of great concern.

For me the created order is a window into the beauty of God, the gift of God, and here we are on the precipice of that beauty collapsing.

During the Trinity season the main colour in our churches will be green, so altars will have green frontals, clergy vestments will be green. It is seen as a season of growth. How do we grow with a sensitivity to our created order? The World Council of Churches promoted the mission statement of Justice, Peace and the Integrity of Creation. If any one of these links break there is the potential for destructive chaos.

I hope and pray however we stop and ponder, contemplate or pray we grow in a sensitivity to our world.

By the way, I was only feeling flat after Lincoln didn't get into the play offs, as we had an uphill battle, but as ever I am hopeful and looking forward to next season.

REPORT FROM THE CHAIR MAY 2023 to MAY 2024

This was a very busy year, and the first full one for our Clerk Kerrie Vickers, who has made an outstanding contribution. We head into the next year with a refurbished hall, much improved financial management, all licences updated and improved, and fully compliant procedures and documentation. Also, linked to the Clerk's role, Kerrie organised two very successful Upshall's Charity events, a pensioner's afternoon tea and a Christmas lunch. I am sure all councillors will join me in acknowledging all that Kerrie has achieved this year.

We began the year by welcoming new NKDC councillor Mitch Elliot and new LCC councillor Alan Briggs, and welcoming back NKDC councillor Peter Overton. On behalf of the Parish Council, I thank them for their attendance and thoughtful contributions to our meetings.

This year saw the conclusion of the, long discussed, project to extend and refurbish the Oliver Roper Village Hall. We began with a public consultation, refined our plans because of the feedback received, obtained planning permission, selected a builder, and completed the project.

The new Scout's Lake Licence was approved, and a Licence for the Bowl's Club, to formalise their relationship with the Parish Council, was negotiated and agreed.

The Bowl's Club Pavilion was repaired and refurbished.

The Parish Council offered support to Oliver Chapple, who opened his field as a

summer recreational amenity for the village. On behalf of all TOTH residents, I thank Oliver for this generous contribution to the community.

Councillor Bob Sheldon, MBE, was awarded the freedom of the parish in recognition of his many years of outstanding service to the community. He joins Ron Bradford, MBE, as the second recipient of the award.

John Burden did a wonderful job of restoring the memorial bench on the green. On behalf of all TOTH residents, I thank John for this important refurbishment of a well-known village feature that badly needed some care and attention.

The Parish Council awarded the following grants to local organisations.

- Thorpe on the Hill Playgroup – £563.96
- St Michael and All Angels Church – £800
- View from the Hill – £820
- St Michael's Church of England School – £239.98

Fosse Green Energy Solar Farm first came to our attention early in the year. A public information event was held, the whole village surveyed, and a local action group formed to oppose the proposal. A Parish Council response was prepared for the non-statutory consultation undertaken by the developers. As we move into the 2024-to-2025-year, resistance to the development of utility scale solar farms close to our village will be of increasing importance and a Parish Council priority.

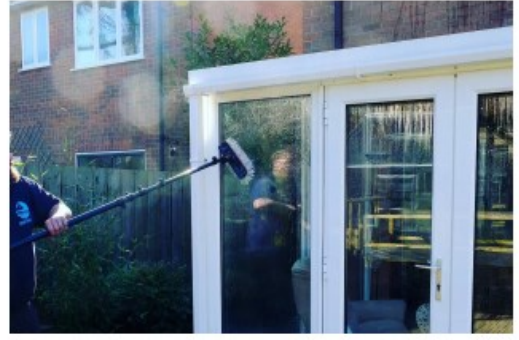
