






### Love your Parish - ThReds Book Club

Book 58 A Man Called Ove by Fredrick Backman (7.5/10) (26th April, 2024)



My thanks to Zoe for this report.

This book definitely split the group with scores ranging from 5 to 9.5, and an overall score of 7.5

Once we had decided how to pronounce his name - Oover, Over, Ovey - he proved to be a tricky character to like, or even feel any empathy with - ranting, angry, rigid, and repetitively so, with this all ramped up for the entertainment value.

We universally rated the translation which we felt was deft, and obviously contributed to the international success of this first novel. We also enjoyed the amusing scenes - reversing the trailer, the encounter with Throat Tattoo during the driving lesson - and recognised ourselves in the frustrations of life involving (especially) technology and others, be they drivers, shop assistants or neighbours.

although the writing on this was quite dispassionate and Ove never seemed to feel sorry for himself, which made it difficult for us to do so too.

Ove definitely was a man of 'black and white' for whom the default response was to give a swift kick, and it was to her credit that Parvaneh persisted, seeing in him the kinder soul and heart of gold which 'belonging' in his community drew out.

#### The Eric East Lake - Dawn Chorus

It was National Dawn Chorus Day on 5th May. I woke early, as I often do at this time of year, and was surprised at how little bird song there was compared to when I first moved to Thorpe. In those days it was so loud, with so many birds, it was impossible to get back to sleep. Later on the morning of the 5th an item on the radio commented on the same thing. The experts explanation was a decline in insect numbers, which probably explains the limited bat activity too.

#### Swallows, swifts, house martins and cuckoos

Where are they?

#### Lapwings

There has been lapwing activity towards the bottom of Clay Lane and, as these birds are on the RSPB red list, it was encouraging to see 6 on one occasion. I also saw 4 lapwings make a sustained attack on a buzzard (mobbing), eventually succeeding in driving away the much bigger bird. This suggests nests in the field. These are no more than small scrapes in the ground, often in short grassland or spring sown crops, but I'm never really sure why birds do this. The nests are especially vulnerable to agricultural activity, particularly this year when the rain prevented cultivation of the land in the autumn. Nearer to Scotland Farm, Bob Sheldon has a field set aside for lapwings.

#### Hedging

The hedging we planted in gaps along Bob Sheldon's Clay Lane field boundaries have benefitted greatly from the incessant rain. Some look like they're tall enough to have their tops taken out.



#### The Eric East Lake

At the time of writing, the island is now completely submerged. This is another indication of the amount of rain we've had over the last several months.

willow, the only survivor from 3 goat willows and 8 aspens which were donated about three years ago. Most were unable to survive the really dry periods.



Spring is well underway so our wardens have, once again, been hard at work around the reserve keeping things ticking. From gorgeous animal babies to beautiful blooming flowers, there's lots to see at Whisby at the moment with means there's also a lot of work to do. Repairing gates and fencing, clearing fallen trees and managing livestock are only a small number of the miracles performed by our warden team each week.



#### Hello,

As I sit and write this piece, I am still waiting to see my first Swift of the year. These marvellous birds migrate from the southern parts of Africa to breed here, and spend most of their lives on the wing. Normally I have seen plenty of these beauties by the end of April.

While we have had bad weather, the April cold/wet snap the absence of Swifts makes me ask are there greater issues at play, such as environmental change. Over recent months I have heard of arable farmers having to re-plant crops at least 3 times due to the unprecedented rainfall of the autumn and winter. What this will do for food security in the coming months must be of great concern.

For me the created order is a window into the beauty of God, the gift of God, and here we are on the precipice of that beauty collapsing.

During the Trinity season the main colour in our churches will be green, so altars will have green frontals, clergy vestments will be green. It is seen as a season of growth. How do we grow with a sensitivity to our created order? The World Council of Churches promoted the mission statement of Justice, Peace and the Integrity of Creation. If any one of these links break there is the potential for destructive chaos.

I hope and pray however we stop and ponder, contemplate or pray we grow in a sensitivity to our world.

By the way, I was only feeling flat after Lincoln didn't get into the play offs, as we had an uphill battle, but as ever I am hopeful and looking forward to next season.
